

9th International Goby Meeting – information

This is the 9th International Goby Meeting, and previous meetings have included presentations covering a wide variety of topics, such as ecology, behaviour, evolution, genomics, phylogenetics, invasive biology, and physiology. The meeting focuses on all gobioid families, for example Gobiidae, Oxudercidae, and Eleotridae.

The meeting will be arranged at [Kristineberg Marine Research Station](#), Fiskebäckskil, Sweden. The meeting starts with dinner evening October 12th and ends after breakfast October 16th. That gives us 3 exciting days to meet and talk about our latest goby research. Deadline to sign up is 20 April 2026. Note we will use a “first come, first served” rule, so please sign up as soon as possible.

Travel information

There are buses from Gothenburg Central, Nils Ericson Terminalen, to Fiskebäckskil. Search for “Göteborg Central, Göteborg” to “Fiskebäckskil, Lysekil” at <https://www.vasttrafik.se/>. In the system, “Göteborg Central”, “Centralstationen”, and “Nils Ericson Terminalen, Göteborg” may appear depending on whether the transport involves trams and city buses, trains, or regional buses.

There are several ways to get to Gothenburg Central: train, ferry, or flight.

Train

There are regular trains from Copenhagen to Gothenburg, operated by both SJ and Öresundståget. In spring 2026, night trains from Berlin and Hamburg will start operating. Both SJ trains and Öresundståget can be booked at www.sj.se. Öresundståget has fixed ticket prices but takes longer travel time. See <https://www.oresundstag.se>.

Ferry

There are daily night ferries from Kiel to Gothenburg, as well as regular ferries from Fredrikshavn/Fredrikshamn. When arriving from Germany, take a tram from Chapmans Torg to Gothenburg Central. Walking routes are not straightforward. When arriving from Denmark, several trams run from Järntorget to Gothenburg Central. See www.stena.se. Stena requires a passport, even when travelling from Denmark.

Flight

Gothenburg Landvetter Airport (GOT) is an international airport located approximately 20 kilometres southeast of Gothenburg. From Landvetter, frequent buses depart just outside the terminal entrance. See <https://www.flygbussarna.se/>. There are clear signs to the taxi rank. Taxi Göteborg offers fixed prices to Gothenburg.
